

The bar chart below shows Malaysia's total risk scores in 4 domains: (1) Business Interactions with Government, (2) Anti-Bribery Laws and Enforcement (3) Government and Civil Service Transparency and (4) Capacity for Civil Society Oversight. The four domain scores are weighted and combined and a risk penalty is added for individual domain scores that exceed the overall country risk score. Each country is given a score from 1 to 100 for each domain, and for the total bribery risk. A higher score indicates a higher risk of business bribery.

- **1. Business Interactions with Government**: Malaysia scores 17 on this measure, indicating very low risk of intensive interaction with the government, very low regulatory burden, and a very low expectation of bribes.
- 2. Anti-Bribery Laws and Enforcement: Malaysia's score of 26 is low.
- **3. Government and Civil Service Transparency**: Malaysia's score of 70 indicates a relatively low quality of administration and governmental transparency.
- **4.** Capacity for Civil Society Oversight: Malaysia's score of 63 suggests a high risk.
