


## **Equatorial Guinea**

**Overall Risk Score: 82** 

Risk Level: very high

This score is a composite of the four domain scores discussed below, which are weighted and combined to produce the overall country risk score. Each country is given a score from 1 to 100 for each domain and for the total bribery risk. A higher score indicates a higher risk of business bribery. Assessments of whether a given domain score is "good" or "poor" are made relative to all other jurisdictions within that domain.

- Business Interactions with Government: Equatorial Guinea receives a poor score of 76 in this domain, based on a high degree of government interaction and a high regulatory burden.
- 2. **Anti-bribery Deterrence and Enforcement:** Equatorial Guinea receives a very poor score of 86 in this domain, based on a very low quality of anti-bribery dissuasion.
- 3. **Government and Civil Service Transparency:** Equatorial Guinea receives a very poor score of 90 in this domain, based on very poor governmental transparency.
- 4. Capacity for Civil Society Oversight: Equatorial Guinea receives a very poor score of 82 in this domain, based on a very low degree of media freedom/quality and a low degree of civil society engagement.



## **TRACE Bribery Risk Typology:**

Authoritarian with limited territorial control

This group is characterized by a lack of strong democracy and lack of effective law enforcement, along with limited control over certain parts of their territory.
