



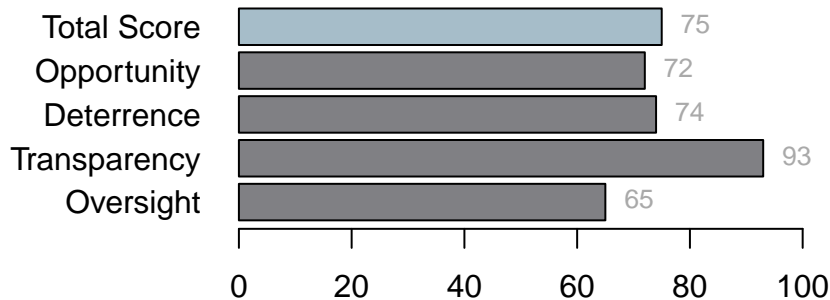
Guinea-Bissau

Overall Risk Score: 75

Risk Level: high

This score is a composite of the four domain scores discussed below, which are weighted and combined to produce the overall country risk score. Each country is given a score from 1 to 100 for each domain and for the total bribery risk. A higher score indicates a higher risk of business bribery. Assessments of whether a given domain score is “good” or “poor” are made relative to all other jurisdictions within that domain.

- 1. Business Interactions with Government:** Guinea-Bissau receives a poor score of 72 in this domain, based on a medium degree of government interaction, a high expectation of bribes, and a high regulatory burden.
- 2. Anti-bribery Deterrence and Enforcement:** Guinea-Bissau receives a poor score of 74 in this domain, based on a low quality of anti-bribery dissuasion.
- 3. Government and Civil Service Transparency:** Guinea-Bissau receives a very poor score of 93 in this domain, based on very poor governmental transparency.
- 4. Capacity for Civil Society Oversight:** Guinea-Bissau receives a poor score of 65 in this domain, based on a medium degree of media freedom/quality and a very low degree of civil society engagement.

This group is typified by a fragile central government that lacks the capacity to control the extent of its territory or all the rungs of its bureaucracy.
