



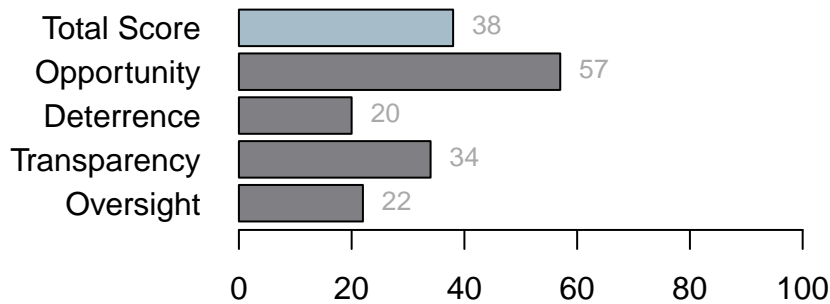
# San Marino

**Overall Risk Score: 38**

**Risk Level: low**

This score is a composite of the four domain scores discussed below, which are weighted and combined to produce the overall country risk score. Each country is given a score from 1 to 100 for each domain and for the total bribery risk. A higher score indicates a higher risk of business bribery. Assessments of whether a given domain score is “good” or “poor” are made relative to all other jurisdictions within that domain.

- 1. Business Interactions with Government:** San Marino receives a medium score of 57 in this domain, based on a medium degree of government interaction and a medium regulatory burden.
- 2. Anti-bribery Deterrence and Enforcement:** San Marino receives a good score of 20 in this domain, based on a high quality of anti-bribery dissuasion.
- 3. Government and Civil Service Transparency:** San Marino receives a good score of 34 in this domain, based on good governmental transparency.
- 4. Capacity for Civil Society Oversight:** San Marino receives a good score of 22 in this domain, based on a high degree of media freedom/quality.



## TRACE Bribery Risk Typology:

**Smaller democracy with strong civil society**

This group can be described as democratic, stable states with strong civil society and smaller economies.
