



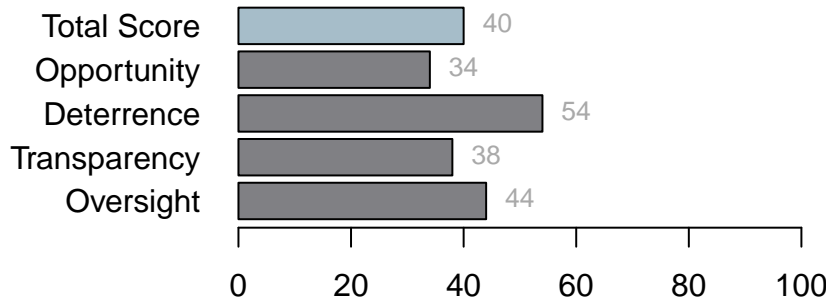
# Malaysia

**Overall Risk Score: 40**

**Risk Level: medium**

This score is a composite of the four domain scores discussed below, which are weighted and combined to produce the overall country risk score. Each country is given a score from 1 to 100 for each domain and for the total bribery risk. A higher score indicates a higher risk of business bribery. Assessments of whether a given domain score is “good” or “poor” are made relative to all other jurisdictions within that domain.

- 1. Business Interactions with Government:** Malaysia receives a good score of 34 in this domain, based on a low degree of government interaction, a medium expectation of bribes, and a very low regulatory burden.
- 2. Anti-bribery Deterrence and Enforcement:** Malaysia receives a medium score of 54 in this domain, based on a low quality of anti-bribery dissuasion and a high quality of anti-bribery enforcement.
- 3. Government and Civil Service Transparency:** Malaysia receives a good score of 38 in this domain, based on medium governmental transparency and good transparency of financial interests.
- 4. Capacity for Civil Society Oversight:** Malaysia receives a medium score of 44 in this domain, based on a medium degree of media freedom/quality and a medium degree of civil society engagement.



## TRACE Bribery Risk Typology:

### Authoritarian with robust enforcement

This group may be described as having a less democratic form of government while maintaining an effective enforcement environment.
